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What is “Communication Competence”?

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Receptive Communication-
Verbal (Listening and Reading)
and Nonverbal (Visual support)



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Expressive Communication-
Verbal (speaking and Writing)
and Nonverbal



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Communication Competence

Help students successfully understand what goes on in school - the curriculum, expected behaviors and tasks, staff and other students

Help students successfully communicate and show what they know



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What can go wrong?

Students may:

- Not understand what you say or write
- Not be able to read textbooks or worksheets
- Not be comfortable asking questions, asking for help or speaking in class
- Not be able to show what they know by writing or speaking



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What can go wrong?

Students may:

- Not be able to socially navigate the "unspoken" rules with peers
- Not be able to pick up on nonverbal cues or abstract language
- Not be able to focus on the current task or follow directions
- Demonstrate negative behaviors as a way of communicating unmet needs

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Teach Using Clear Communication

- Classroom setup and environment
- Positive nurturing relationships
- Visual supports
- Clear expectations
- Concrete language
- Speech rate and vocabulary used



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Whole group vs individual support/scaffolding

- Create routines
- Carefully select visuals and tech features
- ?Modify environment
- ?Modify the task
- Peer vs instructor support to minimize frustration



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Universal Design for Learning- Inclusive Learning

Curriculum and teaching that minimizes barriers and maximizes success for diverse learners

Take the goal, think about the barriers and create flexible pathways

- Present information in different ways
- Give students many ways to show what they know
- Offer choices to fuel interests

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Tech can be good or bad



- Let's maximize the good!
- Help students find their strengths and compensate for weaknesses
- Set up for success and minimize potential harm
- Implement "smart screen time" habits

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Auditory Comprehension- Listening and Attention

- Reduce distractions
- Embed redundant info- provide visual support to supplement fleeting auditory stimuli
- Offer opportunities for repetition and clarification
- Frequent non-confrontational checks for understanding

- Pre-teach the content
- Link to prior knowledge
- Explicit multisensory systematic teaching with phonics for students with dyslexia
- Declutter the page
- Enlarge the print
- Offer text-to-speech for digital content- built in features included on all devices

- Free individual & organization accounts
- Documented print disability
- Customize settings for audio and vision
- Bookshare web reader-Select "read now." No need to download

- Digitize worksheets

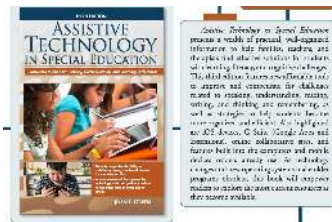
Back in the 1980s, software and devices were developed to help people who were blind, deaf and intellectually impaired.
